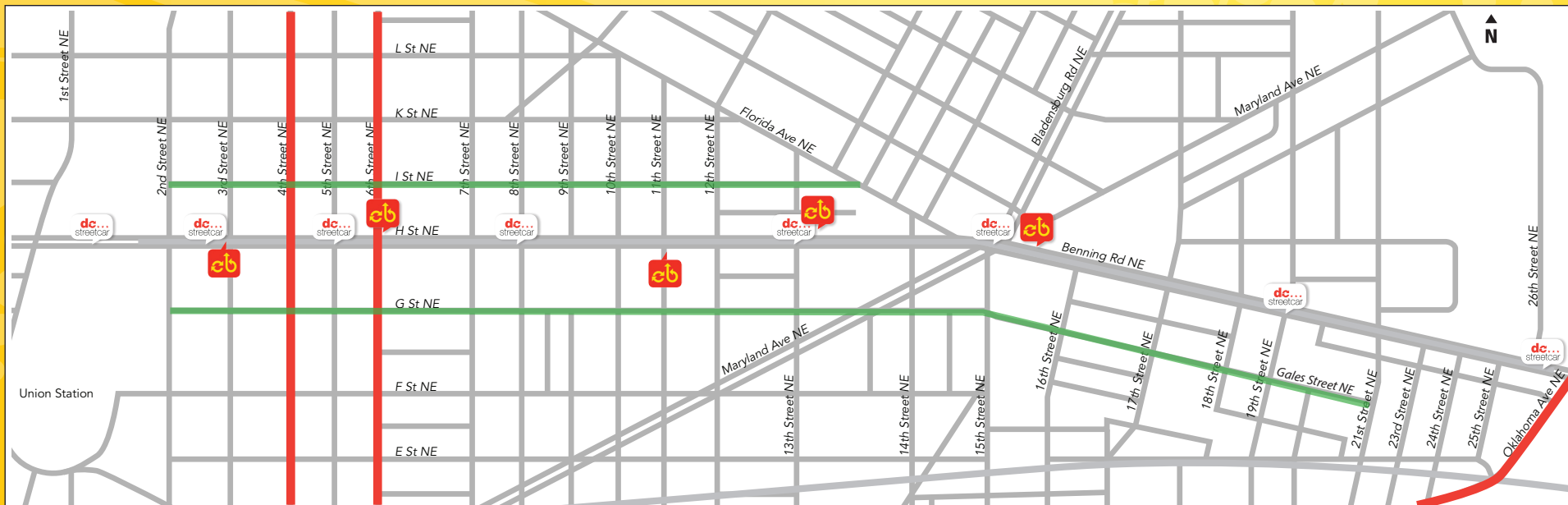

## Alternate Bike Routes

### Alternate to H Street\*

- G Street from 2nd to 15th is one way headed west. It is parallel to H Street.
- I Street from 2nd to 13th is one way headed east. It is parallel to H Street.

**4th Street has a designated bike lane and is one way headed south.**

**6th Street has a designated bike lane and is one way headed north.**

*\*Note: DDOT has added contraflow bike lanes to G and I Streets to allow for two-way bicycle travel.*

### Alternate to Benning Road

- Gales Street from 15th to 23rd is one way headed east. It is parallel to Benning Road.

**Oklahoma Avenue shares its north and south lanes with bikes.**

### Bike Parking

**U-racks for locking bikes are located on both north and south sides of H Street and at intersecting streets between 2nd and 14th Streets.**

### Capital Bike Share locations near DC Streetcar stops:

- 3rd and H Street NE
- 6th and H Street NE
- 11th and H Street NE
- 13th and H Street NE
- Bladensburg and Benning Road NE

## Streetcar Safety Tips

The streetcar tracks on H Street and Benning Road are already a challenge for bicyclists. Follow our safety tips to help prevent accidents:

- Before you ride, decide which streets to take to your destination. Especially during rush hour, consider taking a different route, even if it is less direct.
- Cross tracks at a right angle to avoid falling or tire damage, or walk your bike across.
- When boarding the streetcar, wait for passengers to clear the doorway before moving your bike onto the streetcar.
